## ASSA 2025: Digitalization in Asian Economies

ACAES will organize a session on "Digitalization in Asian Economies" at the 2025 Allied Social Science Association Annual Meeting to be held in San Francisco, January 3-5.

Digitalization is the single biggest structural transformation of the post-COVID global economy. While information and communication technology (ICT) has been around a long time, in the digitalization era its use has been extended and intensified, as evident, for instance, in working from home and online shopping. Asia is a leading player in digitalization. The region is home to major e-commerce firms such as Alibaba and innovative digital public service platforms such as India Stack. This session will explore the potential of digitalization to serve as an engine of economic growth for Asia. A balanced and nuanced perspective that considers both costs and benefits, opportunities and challenges, of digitalization will help Asia leverage ICT for inclusive growth. Empirical papers with policy implications are especially welcome. Topics may include, but are not limited to:
